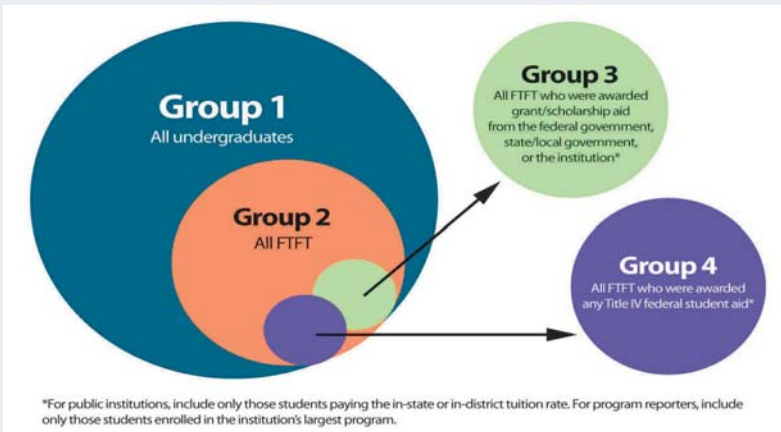

**COA Revisions**

**College Affordability and Transparency Center's lists**
